Year 5 have also been stepping back into history, hosting a fabulous Roman day here at Tenterfields with the Year 5 children from





Manor Way. It was wonderful to see how well they co-operated in their historical research together. On the

sporting front, a particular highlight has been today's All Stars Cricket visiting from Halesowen Cricket Club. Organised by our PE coordinator Mr Griffiths, the All Stars Cricket training has been enjoyed by all of the children here today from Nursery to Year 5. The only class who haven't enjoyed this event, is Year 6, who instead today have been hosted by Manor Way in a dance workshop by the Black Country Dance Company. It sounds as if they

have been having a fabulous time.

It has been a brilliant half term, as we're sure the next one will be. When we return for the second summer half term, it is likely to get warmer, so please can children remember to bring hats and water bottles to keep themselves hydrated throughout the day, particularly at playtimes. What's been happening in school?

Nursery

Nursery class is learning all about life cycles. This week we have been investigating caterpillars and butterflies to see what colours and patterns we could notice. We then had an opportunity to paint and draw our own caterpillars and butterflies describing our choices. In the playdough area we practised our rolling techniques to make wriggly caterpillars and gave them googly eyes and some furry legs. Our fine motor skills have been practised by using tweezers to gain grip strength for our writing. We switched our sand out for soil this week with lots of bugs to investigate using key vocabulary and magnifying glasses. After half term we will be looking more in depth into the life cycle of a butterfly when our very own caterpillars arrive in class and we go on our trip to the butterfly farm.







Reception

Over the last two weeks, we have been reading the story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We have been completing lots of different challenges linked to this story such as drawing, describing and labelling the tiger; writing invitations to invite the tiger for tea; setting up a tea party for the tiger in the role play area; making the tiger and other zoo animals using play dough and painting the tiger or making a tiger out of recyclable materials.

In Phonics, we have continued learning new set 3 sounds including 'er' (a better letter) and 'ow' (brown cow). Please refer to Class Dojo to see what green words and red words we have been learning for and alongside these sounds.

In Maths, we have been learning all about money. We have been learning to recognise the different coins and their values as well as practising paying for items using different coins.

This week we have taken part in a taster cricket session. The children really enjoyed the session and demonstrated some fantastic throwing, catching and batting skills.

Now that the weather is warming up, we have also been spending a little more time exploring in the outdoor area and at Forest School. The children enjoy building obstacle courses riding the bikes and looking for different creatures.









Year I have been enjoying the history theme 'The Great Fire of London.' This week the children visited Selly Manor to learn about life in a Tudor house and the Great Fire of London. Some of the children dressed up as Thomas Farriner the baker, Samuel Pepys, King Charles II and the maid and they retold the story. They played some Tudor style games and had a tour of the black and white Tudor house. They looked in all of the old rooms and learnt about how the house was made. They used wattle and daub to make the house, which is horrid because they used cow wee and cow poo in the daub! This made us laugh. Did you know that they had four poster canopy beds in order to keep creatures such as rats out of the bed?

The children ended this topic with a fabulous finish in Forest School. They had a real campfire and sat around it with toasted marshmallows.

We have been preparing for our phonics screening tests which will take place during the week beginning 14th June. Please encourage your child to look at the phonics words that they have brought home this evening.







Year 2

Wow our first half term together and what a jam packed half term it has been. We have enjoyed our Titanic theme in Curriculum, celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III and going on an adventure with Max the hedgehog. The children have worked incredibly hard with all our topics and have produced some brilliant work.



In Curriculum, we have come to the end of our Titanic topic, which I know we are a little bit sad about, as we have really enjoyed learning about the Titanic. We have

telling us all about the passengers, captain and the

activities available on board.

In art, we have taken inspiration from our Titanic theme and combined it with our art theme of creating sculptures. As a class we worked together to go outside to collect some natural resources and even built our own titanic sculpture on the field. We also made some pictures out of natural resources - the children were very creative and produced an array of pictures from owls to goblins!

Science saw us conduct an experiment all about how our body reacts when exercising. We have been looking at how to keep our bodies healthy. Our experiment allowed us to record how different types of

exercise can change our heart rates, breathing and even our skin.



This week the children have done their key stage 1 SATS. They have worked incredibly hard and I am extremely proud of them all for the effort they have shown this week. As the children have worked extremely hard, we have enjoyed an afternoon outside

an afternoon tea as the first class passengers would have done. We have also enjoyed a cricket taster session learning all of the basic skills we will need on the cricket pitch.




We have had a brilliant and busy end to the half term. In English, we have been learning how to write a non chronological report. We enjoyed using our science knowledge during the shared write and loved showing off everything we have learnt. In our independent writing, we used what we were learning in Curriculum to write a report about the Tudors. Year 3 created some amazing reports that focused on different aspects of the Tudors such as the monarchs, the food and their lives. We are really proud of what we have written and loved sharing our writing across our class.

In Maths, we finished our unit on time. We have been learning how to tell the time to the nearest minute. We found this a challenge at times, but over the last few weeks, our confidence has grown massively and we have been able to read the time successfully. We have just started our new unit of angles and shapes. We have had fun looking at angles and comparing their sizes through the use of an angle finder. This has helped us to understand what an angle is and how they can be found all around us.

The theme of the Tudors has been one of our favourites so far in Curriculum. We have loved learning about Henry VIII and how he could be very violent but how he created rules and religions that have had an impact on our lives today. Year 3 have been able to use their learning to write a short speech about which of the Tudor monarchs was their favourite. We were able to explain clearly about why they were our favourite and the impact that they had on our lives today. Finally we recorded our speeches and shared them with the class.

Finally we ended this half term by having a cricket taster session. We had lots of fun and learnt some new skills about how to throw, catch and hit the ball successfully. We have all worked extremely hard this half term and all deserve a well earned break!












In Year 4, we have had a fantastic and busy end to the half term! In English we have completed our independent writing by using our knowledge of The Plague to write a play script. The children have learned about all the different features of a play script and have used these well to continue their play from where we left off. It was a joy to read all of them! We have just had our first experience day for our new topic and have enjoyed researching all about different whale species. We watched some videos together and shared our facts that we found out.

In Maths, we have begun our new topic of converting measurements. We have been focussing on millimetres, centimetres and metres and how we can use our knowledge of multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 to convert between them. The children have found this quite challenging but have shown the ASPIRE character virtue of resilience. They have not given up even when they have found things really tricky and this has shown in the great progress they have been making. When we come back from our half term break, we will have the Multiplication Tables check. Information about this has been put up on our class dojo; it would be great if the children could continue to do some TTRS practice over the half term.

In Curriculum, we have been learning all about the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings. Year 4 have just completed their Key Assessment Task where they have focussed on the following question: 'Did the Vikings make Britain a better place to live?' They presented their work beautifully, either on a double-page spread in their books, or by creating a PowerPoint presentation on their iPads.

In Science, we have just finished our topic 'animals including humans'. We have learned all about the different parts of the digestive system and how they all work together to help us digest our food. We have also learned about the different types of teeth we have and how they are all designed to complete a unique role when eating.

It's been a fantastic half term and I hope everyone enjoys their half term. Have plenty of rest ready for the last half term of year 4!







What a brilliant end to a busy half term! As usual, there has been lots of exciting learning going on. Our highlight this fortnight, HAS to be our Roman experience day with our Year 5 friends from Manor way. We hope you enjoy looking at some of the moments we captured.

Firstly, Year 5 represented Tenterfields impeccably through their attentive, courteous and discerning behaviour. They enjoyed sharing what they had learnt so far while also finding out lots of new fascinating facts.

Children dressed up and made a real effort - I was very impressed.

Our fantastic day consisted of shield making, team games including a board quiz, workshops about our historical timeline, finding out which

foods were eaten by the Romans and recreating a Roman battle. The children were horrified to find out how the Romans bathed and toileted with a sponge on a stick! We felt very lucky for the social and technological advancements of

today's world. It was exciting learning about the different formations of Roman soldiers in their legions; we practised lots of different positions on the playground and had an opportunity to put our shields to the test as we riled our opposition!



What a busy two weeks we have had. Following on from our SATS; we have been focusing on improving our writing for our end of year assessments. We have been looking at more formal styles of writing including persuasive letters and biographies. I have been really impressed with the quality of writing that has been produced and the focus Year 6 has shown during their independent writing sessions. Here are a few examples:



On Friday we thoroughly enjoyed our dance and performance workshop at Manor Way delivered from Black Country Dance Company.
