What's been happening in school?

Nursery

Nursery have been getting into the festive spirit by decorating the classroom with lights, tinsel and baubles. They have enjoyed chatting about their own Christmas decorations that they have at home. We have been learning about the story of Christmas. The children have acted this out using movements and have watched an interactive version of the story where they noticed characters from their very own Nativity play. In our maths sessions we have been focusing on applying the skills that we have learnt this term such as subitising, recognising numerals, counting and finding totals. We have focused on locating titles in our reading sessions and have enjoyed sharing books with our friends. Our nativity performances have gone brilliantly and we have been amazed at the talent and confidence our young performers have shown.



Reception

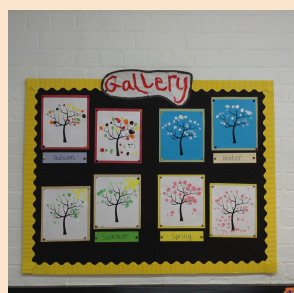
Over the last two weeks, our theme has been 'Christmas'. We have spent a lot of time recently working with Nursery on our Nativity. The children have worked extremely hard to learn all of their lines and know the words and actions to all of the songs for our Nativity. Not only this, but also when to go up onto the stage and where to stand. We are so proud of them all!

In our daily Maths Meeting, we have been talking about entering the new month of 'December', how the season has now changed to 'Winter' and the weather we may experience. In Continuous Provision, the children have been finger painting to show the different seasons we have found in our story 'StickMan'. Some of their artwork is currently displayed in our 'gallery'. The children have also been making Christmas paper chains and hanging tree decorations to put up in our classroom or take home. The children have also been enjoying playing in our small world area with the snow, ice, polar bears and snow flakes. It has also been a busy time making calendars and making and writing Christmas cards as a surprise to take home!

In Phonics, we have learnt the sounds 'y', 'w', 'th', 'z', 'ch' and 'qu' as well as many new green words including 'red', 'vet', 'wish', 'yes', 'lip' and 'up'. We have also continued learning more red words and our new red words are 'you', 'my' and 'no'.

In Maths, we have been learning about measuring and shape. We have been learning to talk about weight using key vocabulary including 'heavy', 'light', 'heavier', 'lighter', 'heaviest' and 'lightest'. We then went on to measure different objects in the classroom using cubes (a non-standard measure). We had a go at recording what we found out. The next week we moved on to learn all about shapes, with a focus on 3D shapes in particular. We have been talking about what we see when looking at 3D shapes, for example, when we look at a cube we can see it is made up of lots of squares. The children have also learnt to use key vocabulary such as 'edges', 'faces' and 'vertices' when talking about the shapes they are using to build with.

In our 'Investigation Area', the question this week has been 'What makes ice melt the quickest?' First of all, the children had to predict whether it was going to be 'heat', 'salt', 'water' or 'nothing'. Once the children had made their predictions, we had fun finding out!



Year 1

Wow! How fabulous was Year 1 in the Christmas Nativity play 'The Angel who nearly missed it all'? Their singing and actions were brilliant! We were so proud of them. Even when they showed a little stage fright at first, they soldiered on and entertained us all! Year 2 acting and singing was amazing too. We particularly loved their singing! We hope you enjoyed the show!

In Maths, we have started our final topic for 2022 with the children using their number bonds to 20 to



support their addition and subtraction problems. In English, we are finalising our 'Firework Night' poems and writing them up in our best handwriting. Next week, we are looking forward to our Year 1 trip to Walsall Arena to watch 'Sleeping Beauty'. We can't wait to see it and then write a review about it in English the next day. Thank you to all our Parents and Carers who have volunteered to support the trip, much appreciated!

In Science, we are looking at animals and their varying habitats across the world. Children have sorted animals into groups and looked at their differing needs.

As the end of term approaches we are going to be super busy with our ASPIRE topic 'What a wonderful world', a Geography topic. The children have already learned the four countries that make up the UK. Next, they will be learning where the capital cities are for each country and looking at features on maps. We looked at our local area landmarks and even found Tenterfields Primary School on an old Ordnance Survey map dated 1913! Watch this space for more details about what we are going to get up to next week! The children will also be busy making Christmas cards and calendars, which we hope you will love! It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas in school!

Year 2

Wow, Year 2! I am sure you all agree the children were amazing in their Nativity Play 'The Angel who nearly missed it'. Fantastic singing, actions and remembering their lines, even though it was our first ever production. What superstars!

Maths has been lots of fun this week as we have started our new topic 'Multiplication and Division'. We have been using 'counters to make arrays, looking at rows and columns to calculate number and worded problems.

In English, we have continued with our text 'I am Neil Armstrong!' A nonfiction text with questions and answers about Armstrong's life. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning more fascinating information about Armstrong's journey to become an astronaut and being the first man to step foot onto the moon.

In Science, the children completed our materials topic. One of our tasks was to use only paper and sellotape to make a bridge that would support a toy car. They worked brilliantly in their teams discussing different ideas and methods to complete the task. Also, we explored why we use various materials for different purposes.

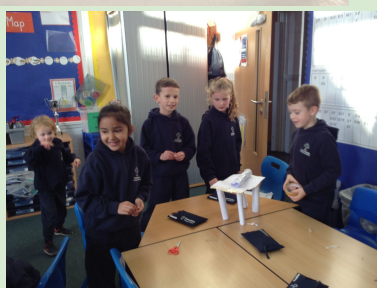
Finally, last week, we were lucky enough to visit RAF Cosford and see planes, engines and rockets linked to our aviation theme. We were able to sit in a plane and use the controls to move the wings, then the children experienced life as a pilot. Dressing up in



various head gear and clothing pilots wore through the ages up until present day. Did you know pilots have wipe board pads on the knees? It was a fabulous day even with rain!

Year 3

We have been very busy in year 3 this week. We have started our new writing unit in English which is based on the story 'The Happy Prince'. We have enjoyed thinking carefully about the meaning of the story and how the vocabulary we use can influence the meaning of the text.

In Maths, we have been working hard practising adding and subtracting 3 digit numbers. Our confidence has grown massively and we are able to use the inverse operation to help us check our answers. In arithmetic, we have been looking at division and how we can use different strategies to help us solve the calculations.

We have finished reading *The BFG* by Roald Dahl which we have really enjoyed. We have found some of the vocabulary interesting to read with lots of weird and wonderful words. Lots of us had already watched the film which helped our understanding, but we were all still gripped and couldn't wait to see what happened at the end of the story. We all had a really good understanding of what we read and we were able to recap everything that had happened. We are looking forward to starting our next story and finding out what it will be.

We have been getting into the Christmas spirit this week and we have been practising our carols for the Halesowen carol service. Everybody did an amazing job and we all sounded lovely, even though it was very cold. We are looking forward to really getting into the Christmas spirit next week.

Year 4

The children in Year 4 have been working really hard this week after completing their NTS tests.

In English, the children have been planning and writing their own holiday brochures based on the Spanish Island of Formentera (The smallest Spanish Island). They have been very persuasive in their writing and they have talked about the geography, food, sites, adventurous activities and weather of this popular holiday destination. I look forward to reading their finished holiday brochures.



We have also continued to read our class book - *The Boy, The Bird and The Coffin Maker* by Matilda Woods. The story is developing into a story of friendship and secrets in the town of Allora.

In Maths, the children have been working on multiplying three digit numbers by one digit numbers using an efficient written method. It has been challenging but great that the children are using their known facts, such as their times tables to support their multiplication calculations. The children have really progressed and improved their scores on TTRockstars this term. Fantastic effort!

In our ASPIRE theme, the children have been looking at the physical and human features of Italy and Iceland to help them decide which country they would like to visit and why.

The children have also enjoyed guessing the Rudolph each day and the school is looking very christmassy. We will be making Christmas cards and calendars which we hope you will love!

Another super week from Year 4. Well done!

Year 5

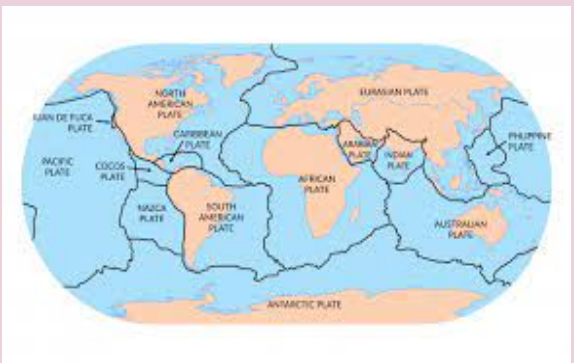
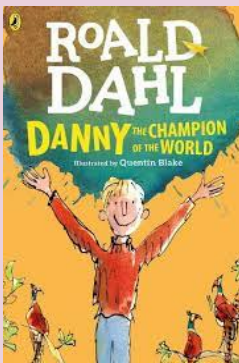
In our ASPIRE theme we have been learning about tectonic plates. We have found out there are oceanic and continental plates. We have looked at the different ways they move, which can cause earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and form mountain ranges. The children have been using the "Keynote" app to create an animation showing the effects of tectonic movement. We have explored natural disasters and the impact they have on people and how areas are affected. The children have also been using their iPads to research Japan and New Zealand and have created a fact file about these countries. In Maths, we have started work on the area and perimeter of shapes.

The children have been enjoying our class book, *Danny the Champion of the World* by Roald Dahl. They have completed a super piece of comprehension work, which shows a great understanding of the text.

During our PE lessons, we have been learning different passing and shooting techniques in netball. We have some fabulous netball players in our class!

We enjoyed our final, whole class forest school session on Tuesday. The children whittled sticks to use as skewers to toast marshmallows around a fire.

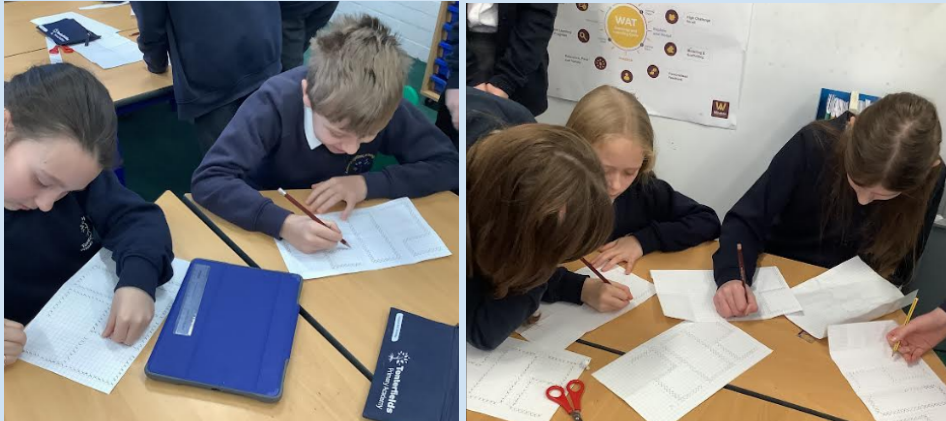

Attendance

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason then please let us know as soon as possible:

- The school office telephone number is 0121 289 5020 where you can speak to a member of staff or leave a messenger on the attendance line
- Report their absence via our Parentmail App

Please be aware you **must** report your child's absence **every day** that they are unable to attend. The information below shows how attendance can affect your child's future progression. If we have not heard from you by 10am after trying all the contact numbers we will do a home visit.

At Tenterfields we aim for pupils to achieve an attendance figure of above 97% or more.

Above 97%: Less than 6 days absence a year – Less than 30 Hours of Learning Lost

Excellent attendance! These young people will almost certainly get the best levels/grades they can, leading to better prospects for the future. Pupils will also get into a habit of attending school which will help in the future.

95%: 10 days absence a year – 50 Hours of Learning Lost

These pupils are less likely to achieve their target levels/grades and will start to find it difficult to maintain a habit of attending school regularly. Pupils who take a two-week holiday every year can only achieve 95% attendance.

90%: 19 days absence a year – 95 Hours of Learning Lost

The Government classes pupils in this group as "Persistent Absentees", and it will be almost impossible to keep up with work and achieve their target levels/grades. Parents of young people in this group could also face the possibility of legal action being taken by Dudley Council, including the issuing of Penalty Notices and Fines.

Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, they will automatically be entitled to free meals under the Free School Meals criteria.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following, you will need to submit an online claim in order for school to receive Pupil Premium Funding.:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit – if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.
