# What's been happening in school?

### Nursery

Nursery have had a lovely start to the spring term. We have welcomed many new faces into our classroom and have been exploring our new topic. The children have been learning how to sit on their carpet spots, line up smartly, share toys, be kind friends and use our manners.

In phonics we have met some aliens who only liked things with the same initial sound as them. During maths, we have been looking at shapes and describing what they look like. We have drawn shape aliens and made some using playdough. In our whole class reading session, we have looked at a text called 'Whatever Next'. It is all about a bear who makes his own rocket and travels to the moon. We have looked at planets and stars and have even thought about where the little bear could go next on his adventures. We ended our topic by making some delicious space rocket biscuits, YUMMY!











# Reception

The children have come back very settled and definitely ready for all of the learning that will take place this Spring Term. They were all so excited to share what they did over the holidays, from chilling at home watching Christmas movies, visits to the park, a trip to the Space Centre and spending time with family and friends. On our first day back, we had a British Values afternoon and spoke about 'The Rule of Law'. It was a great opportunity for us to recap on our 'rules at school' and the children reset their own set of rules to follow.

In Phonics so far this term, we have recapped some set 1 digraphs and we have now started learning our set 2 sounds. Our new set 2 sounds are 'ay', 'ee' and 'igh'. You will now hear your child talking about digraphs (2 letters that make 1 sound) and trigraphs (3 letters that make 1 sound). Our new green words include 'play', 'may', 'day', 'see', 'feet', 'queen', 'high', 'fight' and 'night'.

In Maths, our focus is now on numbers within 10. We have been learning to recognise numbers when they are represented in different ways; counting up to 10 objects reliably and matching a number to the correct numeral.



In Literacy, we will continue to have a fortnightly Whole Class Reading focus text and our first one for these first two weeks has been 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. Our Continuous Provision is based around this text and over the last 2 weeks, we have been busy modelling play dough; making bear masks; drawing and writing linked to the story; counting out bears and matching them to the correct numeral; re-telling the story in our small world and exploring the texture of different materials such as water, mud and grass.

However, this term has seen EYFS start a new writing programme called 'The Write Stuff'. Through this programme, the children will be 'hooked' into different stories and will learn a wide range of new vocabulary. Using this programme, we will also be learning how to structure sentences. The children will be expected to build sentences both verbally as well as beginning to write sentences using their own ideas.









#### Year 1

Wow! What an amazing start we've had already. In Reading, we have started our new Whole Class Read, The Jolly Postman. He delivered a letter from Goldilocks to the Three Bears and the children explored why Goldilocks felt the need to write to them!

In writing, the children have written their own narrative, based on a stimulus of 'Under the Sea'. They have written about dolphins, sea turtles and otters and have carefully edited and copied up their writing. Next week, we will be starting a new Jane Considine English topic; we're sure the children will tell you all about it! In Maths, we have been learning to add and subtract single digit and teen numbers, using number lines and partitioning skills. In Science, we have continued to learn about animals including humans and this week we identified the different body parts of animals. On Friday, the children started their new ASPIRE topic by looking at toys with moving parts, and discussing mechanisms. Next week, we will look at specific movements using levers and sliders. In Geography, the children learned about maps and symbols and even learned a song to remember the four countries that make the United Kingdom.

#### Year 2

Super start to the New Year! The children have thoroughly enjoyed going outside for Forest School exploring in the mud and rain. In Reading, we have started our new text 'Peter Rabbit'. We have found out about the Lake District where the book is set, looking at the beautiful lakes and countryside withthe children making fact sheets about rabbits. Did you know that a rabbit's teeth never stop growing?

In writing, we are using our class text 'Big Cats' to find out many interesting facts about lions, tigers, leopards and cheetahs. We have also researched savannahs, hoarding a range of vocabulary to use in our independent writing.

The Maths theme, this half term, is time. We are recapping o'clock and half past, then progressing to quarter past and quarter to. We are using clocks to illustrate the time and also adding hands to clock faces. Finally, we have been challenging ourselves by looking at how we can tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes.

Our Science topic this term, is animals including humans. We have started by matching adult animals to their babies. Today, we started our ASPIRE Curriculum theme looking at and making puppets. We have started the theme by looking at a variety of different puppets and then choosing one to draw and label. What a busy two weeks!

### Year 3

Year 3 has started this term really positively. They were all excited to come back and they were especially excited to see their friends and to share what they had been up to during their holidays. Since coming back, they have all been working hard and have been challenging themselves more during lessons.

In Maths, we have started a new topic where we have been looking at perimeter and how we can use rulers to measure length. We have used our rulers to help us measure in cm. We then challenged ourselves to see if we could measure in cm and mm to help us be more accurate. We loved the lesson where we had to estimate the length, width or height of an item. Some of us were amazed when our estimations were accurate.


In English, we have started looking at our new text 'The Secret of the Black Rock'. We are loving this text as it is a mystery, and we can't wait to find out what happens next. This text is helping to use our imagination and to become very creative with our vocabulary. We are looking forward to having a go at writing our own story in this style.

Finally, we have started our new theme in Curriculum this week. We found out that we will be designing and creating our own money containers. To help us create some ideas about what we wanted our money containers to look like, we evaluated some money containers and talked about the good and bad points of each design. This helped us to create lots of amazing ideas and has made us eager to start creating them.

### Year 4

Year 4 have had a great start to the week! They have settled in really well and have been showing our Aspire characteristics throughout the school day. Children have been given classroom jobs, including handing out books and resources. They have responded well to these jobs and have been showing great responsibility in the classroom.

In Maths, we have been learning all about data and how we can represent this in different ways. The children have been looking at frequency tables, tally charts, pictograms and bar charts. This is something they have found quite tricky, however, they have shown great resilience and have not given up!





In Reading, we are continuing with our class reader 'The Boy, The Bird and The Coffin Maker'. The children are really enjoying this book and have shown a great understanding of the story as they were able to explain what happened in the first half of the story as well as make accurate predictions as to what is going to happen next.

In English, the children have recently started exploring poetry. We have listened to a poem called 'The River' by Valerie Bloom and have been expanding our vocabulary. In the upcoming weeks, the children will be using their own vocabulary to write their own poems which I am looking forward to reading.


Lastly, we have started our new curriculum topic where we are focussing on DT. Our big question is 'How can I use recycled materials and electrical components to make a torch?'. This is a topic that everyone seems really excited about. We have started our research about different types of torches and their inventors and will be making links to Science when we discuss the type of circuit we will need to make our torch work.

### Year 5

Firstly, I would like to say a big thank you to Year 5 for being so welcoming during my first couple of weeks at Tenterfields! They have settled into the Spring term well.

I have been impressed with their attitude towards change, both in their learning topics and new routines - every child in Year 5 has taken on a class responsibility. Our class monitors have all sprung into action and it is great to see them take to their new roles with dedication.

In our Maths learning, we have been developing our understanding of the long multiplication method. The children have shown great levels of persistence and resilience when learning and applying the steps involved in this method. Their times tables skills have also improved during this learning and it is great to see children solving problems with increasingly large numbers.



I am delighted to share that Year 5 are loving their new class books: 'Holes' and 'Cosmic'! The protagonists in both narratives are captivating and pupils have empathised with character emotion and motives – key reading skills. Both our reading and writing lessons have broadened existing vocabulary to help us to make more ambitious choices when composing our own sentences.

Year 5 are also very excited to learn about difference stitching skills in order to complete our D.T curriculum topic. We will eventually be making cushions. Thank you to all families who have been supporting us by answering our prototype research questionnaire.

Finally, pupils in Year 5 are getting very excited to have a wonderful time at the Birmingham Hippodrome during our

trip to see Dick Whittington on Friday. I am sure it will be a brilliant show and thoroughly enjoyed by all pupils.




#### Year 6

We have had a wonderful week beginning our new DT theme called 'Grand Designs'. Over the next few weeks we will be designing and creating our own sustainably-powered vehicle. We began the week by comparing different energy sources e.g. petrol, diesel, electric etc... Whilst we acknowledged there were some negatives, electric power was the most sustainable whilst also being effective. As a result of this finding, we began to investigate how electric cars are powered. We investigated circuits and looked at how electrical components can be incorporated e.g. bulbs, switches, buzzers, motors. Year 6 thoroughly enjoyed exploring this and creating their own working circuits. Next week, we will begin to look at how we can create the chassis and shell of our car.







In Maths, we have been looking at finding missing angles in triangles and quadrilaterals. We have discovered that angles in a triangle must add up to 180° and 360° in a quadrilateral. We have used our knowledge of angles to reason and problem solve.

In English, we have continued with our writing around The Graveyard Book. Children have been writing the next chapter of the story incorporating their own creative ideas. Next week, we will be looking at editing these stories by improving language and punctuation choices. I look forward to sharing some of these with you next week.

### **Attendance**

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason then please let us know as soon as possible:

- The school office telephone number is 0121 289 5020 where you can speak to a member of staff or leave a messenger on the attendance line
- Report their absence via our Parentmail App

Please be aware you **must** report your child's absence **every day** that they are unable to attend. The information below shows how attendance can affect your child's future progression. If we have not heard from you by 10am after trying all the contact numbers we will do a home visit.

At Tenterfields we aim for pupils to achieve an attendance figure of above 97% or more.

### Above 97%: Less than 6 days absence a year – Less than 30 Hours of Learning Lost

Excellent attendance! These young people will almost certainly get the best levels/grades they can, leading to better prospects for the future. Pupils will also get into a habit of attending school which will help in the future.

## 95%: 10 days absence a year – 50 Hours of Learning Lost

These pupils are less likely to achieve their target levels/grades and will start to find it difficult to maintain a habit of attending school regularly. Pupils who take a two-week holiday every year can only achieve 95% attendance.

# 90%: 19 days absence a year – 95 Hours of Learning Lost

The Government classes pupils in this group as "Persistent Absentees", and it will be almost impossible to keep up with work and achieve their target levels/grades. Parents of young people in this group could also face the possibility of legal action being taken by Dudley Council, including the issuing of Penalty Notices and Fines.

## **Free School Meals**

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, they will automatically be entitled to free meals under the Free School Meals criteria.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following, you will need to submit an online claim in order for school to receive Pupil Premium Funding.:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).
- Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.
