What's been happening in school?

Nursery

Nursery have had a brilliant end to the summer term. They practised hard for their sports day and graduation ceremony and have enjoyed stay and plays with either their new teacher or their new friends who will be joining nursery.

The children have also enjoyed learning about their new class text 'Little Red Riding Hood' We have discussed good character and bad characters and the reasons why we think this. In maths we have looked at 2D shape arrangements. We have also been really enjoying the train set and have made incredible train tracks each day as a team.









Reception

It has been a very busy last 2 weeks of term with Sports Day, Graduation and welcoming in the new Reception children for September. The children have been fantastic throughout the whole time! Our story for the final 2 weeks has been 'Supertato' and Evil Pea has been up to all kinds of things in our classroom. Evil Pea scattered peas all over our classroom; stepped in paint and we found footsteps everywhere and he taped some of the vegetables to our tables. We have been thinking about what a superhero Supertato actually is and linked this to things that we are proud we have achieved this year.

In Maths, our focus has been on measurement, money and shape. We have been learning to use the language for measuring capacity, mass and length as well as counting money and recognising and describing different 2D and 3D shapes.

In Phonics, we have spent some time recapping set 2 sounds including igh, ow, oo (poo at the zoo) and oo (look at a book). We have been practising reading these sounds in words and in sentences as well as writing using these sounds.

Last week Reception had an introduction to Forest School and absolutely loved it. They have also had a taster of playing on the 'big' playground at lunchtime where they will play when they go into Year 1.











Year 1

We have been very busy in Year 1! We have continued learning about food in our global affairs topic and we have been learning about the different types of food that are eaten across the world. We have continued our work on food banks and we have planned a fundraising activity to raise money for The Black Country Foodbank. We are going to walk around the MUGA twenty times throughout the day on Friday. We are also going to bring in a breakfast food donation.

In English we continued with our fantastic Pinocchio story and we planned and wrote our own different endings to Pinocchio. We used a wide range of skills in our stories which we had been learning about in class, such as using time adverbials, similes, describing our feelings and using a range of punctuation. We even edited our amazing stories.

In maths we have been learning about multiplication and division. We have been learning about division as sharing and grouping, arrays and fractions as a quantity. We have been using practical equipment such as cubes and bead strings to help us with this and we have been using part-whole models to describe it.

In science we continued our materials theme by thinking about the properties of materials and sorting different items into groups according to their properties. We worked as a class to do this first of all and then we split into small groups. We talked about each item and its properties and then we came to an agreement about which group it belonged in.





Year 2

What a busy time we have had in Year 2. From caring for our beans (which have grown at a rapid rate) to undergoing a full scale search for our missing felt pens...

In science we have really enjoyed caring for and monitoring our beans ,watching them turn from seeds into enormous bean stalks. The children took great care watering the plants daily and measuring their growth. They were amazed how quickly they grew.

Maths this week has been looking at mass. Using balancing scales to weigh fruit and objects around the classroom the children then used these skills to solve problems involving mass.

Our English text is 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. We have looked at the letters sent by the crayons spotting the features needed in a letter. Then mysteriously on Thursday evening our felt pens disappeared from the classroom... We received a very disgruntled letter from the pens telling the children how badly they had been treated! We hot seated some of the felt pens, asking them how they felt and why they had disappeared. We were horrified at how we had treated the pens and set about righting our wrong. The children made missing posters apologising and asking the pens to return, promising to treat them better in the future. The children had a fabulous time and produced some amazing work (you will be pleased to know the pens have now returned to Year 2 safe and sound).



Finally in our ASPIRE theme 'Plastic Pollution' the children decided to recycle our plastic waste by turning plastic bottles into beautifully decorated plant pots.

Year 3

What a super end to being in year 3. This week we have finished our ASPIRE topic and we have spent time evaluating, designing and creating our own medals which could be used in the commonwealth games. These medals were created to show inclusivity and to make everyone feel welcome. The medals that they created were amazing.

This week we have finished our last independent write of the year. We have written our own stories which were based on the story of 'the three little pigs'. They have shown what amazing writers they are and they have all created wonderful storylines which have interesting twists in.

We have finished our last maths unit as well where we have practised our times tables and have looked at different methods which will help us learn them. We have worked really hard with our maths this year and it will certainly help us in year 4.









Year 4

In English, the children have been learning, and recapping persuasive writing and what makes an effective persuasive piece, and have used this knowledge to create a piece of independent writing about a pasta alternative to plastic straws, called the 'Stroodle'. The children have come to English

lessons with many incredible ideas, especially when they were writing puns for their pieces, being incredibly creative with their thinking. This has further built on our learning from Curriculum, where we have been looking at how plastic pollution has affected our oceans, and also from our previous English topic. We have also finished reading our class story, 'The Boy at the Back of the classroom', the children really liked that the story had a happy ending for Ahmet, and enjoyed taking turns reading the story out.

In Maths, the children have been learning all about the different types of angles, and how to identify them within shapes too. The children have been very resilient with this learning, and have not given up when identifying the different angels, how they can tell the different ones apart, and drawing shapes with the different types in them.

On Wednesday we had Dudley Performing Arts come in, and speak about a variety of instruments such as a keyboard, flute, and guitar. The children were very keen to get involved with answering questions, and singing in time to a beat. The children enjoyed this a lot, and many of them have felt very inspired by this and are very keen to get into learning instruments themselves!

The children also had a chance to be incredibly creative during Curriculum, where they brought in plastic bottles, and recycled them by making lava lamps out of water, glitter, and paint! This was very exciting, and has inspired many of the children to go home and create their own lava lamps from a variety of plastic objects, which was fantastic to hear all about!

Year 5

Wow! What a year we have had! It seems to have absolutely flown by and I can't believe we are nearly ready to move into Year 6! We are very excited to move into the Year 6 classroom next week and begin to think about some of the leadership roles we may want to apply for. The letter regarding the Y6 residential to the Pioneer Centre went out last week and there have been lots of questions about it. Don't worry, we will have a parent information session during the Autumn term.

In English we have completed our persuasive speeches around global issues that are close to our hearts. These have ranged from: deforestation, global warming, animal testing to Black Lives Matter. Year 5 have strong opinions about these topics and wanted to persuade others too. They have also enjoyed some free writing sessions where they have been able to demonstrate their creative imaginations. There have been diaries, stories, poems, letters and many more.

In Maths we completed our final Maths unit in 2D and 3D shape. We have looked at regular and irregular shapes and have used geoboards to name, make and describe them. We have looked at different types of triangles, quadrilaterals using higher level mathematical vocabulary to describe them.

Well done Year 5, it's been a pleasure; I'm looking forward to what Year 6 brings. Have a wonderful break, keep safe and I wonder how many of the Summer challenges you can complete?

Year 6

Year 6 are having an amazing time rehearsing for their end of year performance! All the children have put their heart and soul into learning their lines, songs and choreography. I am truly proud of what they have achieved and you as parents are in for a real treat!


Well done Year 6 and continue to flourish on your next journey through high school. You will be missed!

All you have to do is:



Forest School

We are very excited to announce that Miss Ellerton will be running forest school this year for all children across the school. This will be embedded into their timetable as it is an important part of the curriculum. Each year group will receive forest school sessions for half a term and will get to explore the outdoor area in an exciting and risky way. Forest school is underpinned by six principles that we would like to share with you:



- Taking place in an appropriate environment
- A holistic approach which create resilient, creative, confident and independent learners
 - Offers opportunities to take risks
 - Run by a qualified Forest School practitioner
 - A learner centred approach

During our forest schools sessions we will look at environmental knowledge, fire lighting, cooking, safe tool use, risky play and self management. We are very excited to begin these sessions.







We are incredibly excited to announce the launch of two new English challenges: #WATaPoet and #WATaSpeller.

#WATaPoet

To achieve a **#WATaPoet badge**, the children will need to learn by heart the poems set for their year group and then recite them to a teacher. They do not need to be learnt all at once but can be spaced throughout the year.

#WATaSpeller

To achieve a <u>#WATaSpeller</u> badge, the children will need to be able to read the words and learn the spellings for their year group. They do not need to be learnt all at once but can be spaced throughout the year, using each 'Spelling Rocket' as a quide.



Year 6 15:30 Summer Reading Challenge

To encourage our new Year 6 pupils to read, read and read some more in preparation for their SATs, we are setting them a challenge.

The aim is to read for 15 minutes a day, for 30 days. If they are able to successfully complete the challenge, they will be rewarded with a green ticket which will entitle them to an afternoon in forest school

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, they will automatically be entitled to free meals under the Free School Meals criteria.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following, you will need to submit an online claim in order for school to receive Pupil Premium Funding.:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.
