What's been happening in school

Nursery

This week we have been exploring our new surroundings and finding out all of the exciting activities that we can do at nursery. We have been painting, sculpting with play dough, making our own small world and even playing builders and babies in the role play. We were able to get really messy in the tuff tray with shaving foam and painting rollers. We also have a brand new outdoor area which we were able to play in with hoops, balls, hoppers and building equipment. We got to meet the new PE teacher too and enjoyed playing a Mr Men game with her.

Reception

This week we have been settling in, learning the rules and routines and discovering all the amazing things we can do in our classroom and outdoor area. With some new children joining the school since Nursery, we spent some time introducing ourselves to help us make new friends. We have since been putting together puzzles; drawing and painting; moulding with play dough; making patterns with shapes; acting in the role area; building models and playing in the small world and construction area.

The children have also had their first PE lesson with their new PE teacher for this year and they came back so excited to share the fun games they had played.

Year 1

We have had a brilliant start to Year 1! Children came into school beautifully and have settled in extremely well. They have been learning all of the new routines in KS1 and have been taking it all in their stride! I am so proud of each and every one of them. Children loved sharing stories about their Summer holidays and have enjoyed writing holiday news. We have been talking about careers and Year 1



wrote about what they would like to be when they are older. We have also had lots of fun being historical detectives, looking for clues to identify each other from all of the gorgeous baby photos! Children were amazing at finding clues and even managed to guess some of their friends from the pictures! We have started our new reading book The Enormous Crocodile and have been describing the



crocodile. We have been using tens frames to cout sets of objects in Maths and enjoyed making towers to represent objects with friends.

Year 2

We wrote our ASPIRE sentences this week, we have a lot of budding police officers and nurses. As well as this the children gave themselves aims for the year, thinking about areas they would like to improve upon. We have also all

discussed our holiday adventures and the fun we had with our families and friends. We then used our phonics and writing skills to write recounts of holiday news. In our curriculum lesson the children researched what we would need to do to become a historian ready for our new topic next week, the children were very excited. Maths this week was exploring place value to 100, we counted in tens by grouping cubes together. Our whole class reading text is 'The Fantastic Mr Fox'. The children were able to recall many other texts written by Roald Dahl including the 'Enormous Crocodile'. We then watched a clip about foxes in urban gardens, we were able to think of many fox facts, the children asked some fabulous questions about habitat and diet.



Year 3


We have settled in well this week and I have enjoyed hearing all about their summer. We have had a busy week as we have started our new curriculum. The children became historical detectives and completed a treasure hunt where they had to try and work out what our new topic is. They all worked really hard particularly in the heat. In Maths we have started looking at numbers and how we can represent numbers in different ways. The children have designed number posters and have thought of many creative ways to show their ideas. We have started to read the 'BFG' and have thought about what might happen next in the story. We have all written our ASPIRE sentences and I was impressed by the variety of careers and how the children aim to achieve them. In English we started a piece of writing based on an image of a turtle under the sea. The children have worked really hard to think of different ways to show off their writing skills such as stories, diary entries and even newspapers.


Year 4

We have started this year as we mean to go on - with high expectations. I have been impressed with the behaviour and attitude of the children. We have begun our key text - 'James and the Giant Peach' by Roald Dahl. The children have really enjoyed their first few chapters and were keen to make predictions about what will happen further into the story. Also, in Maths the children have been learning to recognise the place value of each digit in a four-digit number. In PE, the children had fun playing 'Stick in the Mud' and they really thought about how to use the space to escape the catchers. The children have told me all about the exciting things that they have done in the Summer holidays and were keen to show and tell to the rest of the class. The children have written their ASPIRE sentences this week as well and I was amazed at the variety of the careers that the children were interested in doing when they were older. The children could talk about how they would achieve their aspirational careers.

Year 5

We had a great start to the year! I have been particularly impressed with how quickly everyone has settled back into routine and has given 100% effort with their learning. We have begun our new curriculum theme 'Historical Detectives' based on the Ancient Greeks. We started with a code breaking activity where children had to decipher a letter written using the Greek alphabet. We all found it quite challenging but we showed great resilience and didn't give up. The big question for our theme is 'What impact did the Ancient Greeks have on modern day society?'. We are excited to learn about the Greek Gods and Goddesses as well as Greek myths. In addition to this, we have been thinking about our aspirations for the school year alongside our aspirations for our future careers. Year 5 were articulate and could explain their chosen careers and what they needed to do to achieve it. Keep up the great work Year 5, I'm already excited for next week!





Year 6

We have been working hard to set ourselves and each other high expectations of the year to come. We have settled back into school life wonderfully and have already been wow-ing me with their fantastic attitude to learning. This week we have been considering our 'aspire sentences'. Not only have we considered what career and path we would like to follow when we are older, we have also identified what we can do now to help us achieve our aspirations. On Monday, we went on a trip on an airplane! We had our passports checked and boarded 6H airlines to a mystery location. After a small bit of turbulence, Year 6 noticed that the landscape around us was changing from lush green grass to a desolate desert. After spotting a pyramid in the distance, Year 6 correctly guessed we had safely landed in Cairo, Egypt and that our new curriculum theme 'Historical Detectives' is based on the Ancient Egyptians! We are all very excited to learn about how Egyptians lived, worked and were able to create such incredible structures! It has been a fantastic first week in Year 6, I can't wait for next week!

School Entry starting Monday 13th September

We have been reviewing school entry procedures since returning, and we are very thankful to everyone for their considerate approach and patience. From Monday, we would like to welcome **all years from Reception through to Year 6** to drop off their children on the **main school playground**.

Years 4, 5 & 6 will enter in the top KS2 door, Years 1, 2 & 3 will enter in the bottom KS1 door and Reception will rejoin us and will enter school via the ramp and glass door at the bottom of the playground.

Hopefully this will greatly help those families moving forwards who have siblings to drop off and pick up. Again, thank you for your patience and we will continue to monitor and review processes.

Roald Dahl Day - Monday 13th September



Something of an unexpected success after its 2015 debut, Rocket League settled into a steady if unspectacular groove of moderate audiences in the following years. Like many online video games, however, it enjoyed a significant spike in popularity over recent months as children and young people sought entertainment during lockdown.

Over-consumption, in fact, is one of the main issues with the game – which relies on frequent (and occasionally long) sessions of play if users want to progress up the rankings. Today's #WakeUpWednesday guide to the game also pinpoints potential risks including in-game purchases and the possibility of scams which target naïve younger players.
